GENERAL INFORMATION

CAMP AUGUSTINE

Camp Augustine is located South of Grand Island along the Platte River. Go North off I-80 exit 312 onto Highway 281, go to Lewis Greenscapes Nursery and turn east. Proceed to Locust Street and turn south. Go to Camp Augustine Road and turn west and follow the road into camp. Locust Street is also accessible from the north via Hwy. 34. You may also take I-80 exit 314, go north on Locust Street about one 1/2 mile, turn west onto Camp Augustine Road.

CHECK-IN

Packs are recommended to travel together. Packs will not be able to check in until all participants have arrived. Once all have arrived the Cub Scout Resident Camp Adult Leaders should go directly to the Visitor's Center at camp. The Visitors' Center is the log building on the west side of the parking lot. Eagle Lodge is the first red building south of the main parking lot. Eagle Lodge also serves as the first aid station for camp. During check-in packs will get their campsite assignment, be given a trash bag for their campsite and get information about camp activities and schedules.

CAMP HOUSING

Tents on platforms are provided for all campers. These are canvas wall tents. If you wish, you may bring your own tent. Cots are available to rent on a first come first serve basis for \$5.00.

VEHICLES

Only camp vehicles are allowed to drive on the camp roads beyond the parking lot. Your scouts should plan on carrying their gear to a specified area or to their campsite. Transporting of equipment will be provided if needed.

LEAVING CAMP

Everyone must check in and out of camp on the sheets provided outside the Visitors Center whenever they arrive or leave during the camping session. This allows us to keep track of who is in camp in case of an emergency.

PROGRAM

Cub Leaders and parents are encouraged to help staff with program areas. Please don't hesitate to ask how you can help out.

CHAPEL/CAMPFIRE

A chapel service will be held during your stay at camp. Cub Scouts will have a campfire on opening night and closing night. Each Den or Pack or campsite is asked to provide a song, stunt or skit for the program. So, be sure to come prepared to ***"SHOW OFF YOUR TALENTS!"***

THE ADULT PARTNER IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THEIR SCOUT WHILE IN CAMP. AS IN ALL SCOUTING WE FOLLOW THE LAW OF THE PACK AND CUB SCOUT PROMISE.

SPECIFIC INFORMATION

FIRST AID

ALL PARTICIPANTS, (youth and adult), MUST COMPLETE A HEALTH HISTORY FORM.
A reproducible form is enclosed with this booklet.

First aid treatment is available in camp 24 hours a day at Eagle lodge. Any and all first aid situations must be brought to the immediate attention of the camp health officer.

Prescription medication a Scout or leader brings to camp must be checked in at the health lodge at check-in. The Scout or leader will go to the lodge at arranged times for the medication so the health officer can keep a complete medical log. The health officer upon arrival at camp must approve any exceptions to this policy. Anyone who takes medication, which is required to be refrigerated, should bring well-documented information for the health officer and give the information to him at check-in. Also, anyone with a serious medical condition which may require immediate medication in case of emergency is requested to bring enough medication so that both adult leader and health lodge have appropriate doses, as approved by the camper's doctor.

CANOE USE

Boating will not be available during Cub Scout Resident Camp. However the lake is available for fishing.

VALUABLES

Unfortunately, even at scout camp, losses occur. Everyone takes full personal responsibility for all items brought to camp. A good idea is to bring a locking trunk to camp for valuables. Valuables also may be locked in a vehicle or at the Trading Post.

TRADING POST

Camp Augustine offers a trading post with shirts, hats, and other souvenir items, craft kits, snacks, drinks, stamps, and many items from the B.S.A. catalog. Most boys bring \$30—\$40 to spend in the trading post. Small denomination bills and change for the drink machine is helpful.

CHECK-OUT

Before checking out be sure to return all cots to the Quartermaster area and trash to the roadside cans by your campsite. As Scouts we are reminded that we should be sure to have all campsites looking better than we found them. All cars are to be parked only in the camp parking lot. B.S.A. policy does not allow *unauthorized* vehicles in campsites. Please plan to pack out all equipment from your campsites.

REFUND POLICY

Contact either Scout Service Center for Refund policy information. Generally, no more than 75% of the fee is granted.

PLANNED EARLY DEPARTURES FROM CAMP

Any Scout who plans to depart camp other than with his pack (example to play ball) at any time other than the morning your camp is over **MUST** have a signed release by the custodial parent turned in at check in. When the adult arrives at Camp to pick up the Scout they will be asked to provide identification.

The BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA and the Overland Trails Council recognize the possibility that a non-custodial parent or another adult could abduct a child while they are in attendance at camp. This policy is designed to prevent such an occurrence and is an added safety for you and your child. No exception will be made to this policy.
